Piseco Lake Physical Characteristics



- Watershed area 38,023 acres with 2% developed
- Shoreline 21.3 miles
- Lake mean depth 58 feet/maximum depth 124 feet

- Invasive plant/animal species
- Nutrient levels
- Recreational use
- Water level/spillway management
- In 1995, Members Identified Lake Fish habitat risks

Community Actions – Lake Monitoring

- PF&G Initiated monitoring in 1996
- Followed CSLAP/NYSFOLA guidelines
- Results did not indicate water quality concerns



Community Actions – Lake Water Level/Spillway Management

- Lawsuit to remove spillway to lower lake level
- Majority of residents against lawsuit
- Piseco Lake Associations (PLA) formed to counteract lawsuit
- PF&G becomes PLA in 2011
- Lawsuit defeated 2014


